

- 1) Lead over pole, and mount
- 2) Trot serpentine
- 3) Trot
- 4) Trot over poles
- 5) Walk over bridge
- 6) Side pass left
- 7) Side pass right
- 8) Trot to cone & stop

\*Drop bit in front of the camera at the end of your ride and close up.

## Set Up

- 1) 20 ft between cone A & pole
- 2) 20 ft between pole & cone B
- 3) 20 ft between cone B & C
- 4) 20 ft between cone C & D
- 5) 3 1/2ft between poles
- 6) 20ft between poles & bridge
- 7) 20ft between bridge & pole
- 8) 30ft between pole & cone

## Approved Material

- 1) Bridge Any Bridge you have or
- a 4x8 piece of plywood
- 2) Poles 8ft pole or something close
- 3) Cones or Buckets

## **Video Submission Tips and Instructions**

- Mustangs may be exhibited in English, Western or other appropriate equine styles and
  equipment. Exhibitors are asked to wear appropriate attire and head gear, which reflects the style
  of their riding. Silver on your saddles or sequins on your shirts will not earn you any extra points.
- Trainers need to be aware of the background, attire, lighting, personal connection with horse, and size of arena.
- At the beginning of each video, the competitor (or camera person) must state their name, horse name, and class.
- The camera/recording device of choice must be positioned as designated on the pattern for each class.
- If the recording device of choice is a cell phone, the video must be created in horizontal format
  which means the phone needs to be turned sideways.
- When videoing each class, the entire handler and their horse MUST always be within the frame of the camera.
- If there are any shots that are out of focus or the handler/horse go out of frame during a run, there could be a chance of disqualifying the submission.
- Do not zoom in/out once you have started recording the class.
- The video must be recorded from beginning to end. There will not be any editing allowed. If there is questionable content, then there could be a chance of disqualifying the submission.
